

(c) Since the building is to come up in the next 18 months, there is no need to go in for a temporary structure initially.

2. Other decisions taken were as follows :

(i) A hand out for the Institute may be prepared immediately which would also facilitate its publicity.

(ii) An advertisement may be inserted for the finalisation of the legs for the Institute.

(iii) For the next programme of the Institute, a workshop may be held for coordinating training needs so that Institute would be able to draw up a model training manual for training in IDARs, TORCs and TOCs.

(iv) Recruitment process may begin once the formal acceptance is received from the Department of Expenditure.

(v) Steps may be initiated for the purchase of a car for the Institute. However, the Department may explore the possibility of obtaining a vehicle from one of the U.N. agencies by way of grant.
